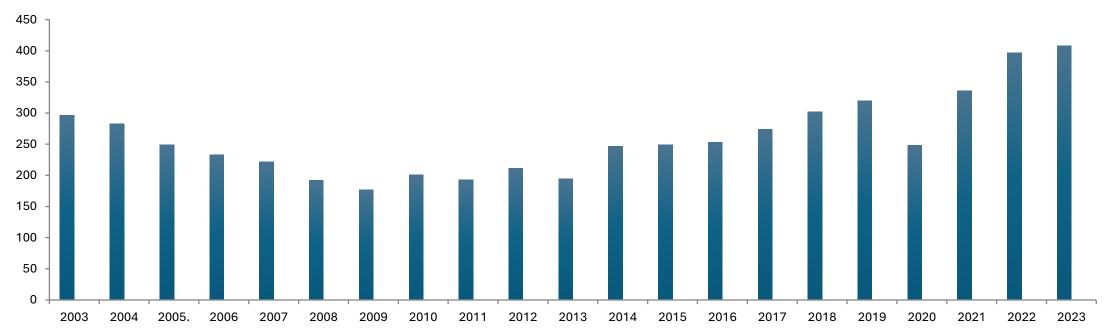

Membership Software

- Wild Apricot implemented January 2023, and Paypal for payments
 - RBC and RBCGS in same database
 - Automated membership and event registration and with auto-matching of payments
- July 2023 split out RBCGS to a separate licence
- 4Q 2023 replaced Paypal with Stripe (RBC only)
- Development now complete and administration highly automated
- 2024 push for all members to use Stripe auto matching of cash
